THE M20 MOTORWAY - JUNCTION 9
TEMPORARY OVERNIGHT SLIP ROAD CLOSURES

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Secretary of State for Transport intends to make an Order on the M20 Motorway, near Ashford in the County of Kent, under section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 because works are proposed to be executed on the road.

The effect of the Order would be to authorise the overnight closure of the following slip roads-

- (a) the road leading from the coastbound carriageway of the M20 to the A20 (Fougeres Way) at Junction 9; and
- (b) the road leading from the Londonbound carriageway of the M20 to the A20 (Fougeres Way) at Junction 9.

These measures would be in the interests of road safety while contractors undertake resurfacing work.

It is expected that the work would last for approximately 14 nights (7 nights for each slip road) starting on or after Monday 16th August 2010 between 2100 and 0600 hours.

The Order would come into force on 14th August 2010 and have a maximum duration of eighteen months.

During the closure outlined at (a) above, traffic affected would be diverted on the coastbound carriageway of the M20 to Junction 10 (A2070/A20/A292) and return on the Londonbound carriageway of the M20 to Junction 9. During the closure outlined at (b) above, traffic affected would be diverted at Junction 10 (A2070/A20/A292) to join the A292 Hythe Road/Mace Lane/Somerset Road/New Street/Chart Road/Maidstone Road to join the A20 Fougeres Way.

The slip road closures and diversion routes would be clearly indicated by traffic signs when they are in operation during the work periods.
